## General Information for this morning

**Welcome Families!** At St. Paul's we hope to create an atmosphere in which all families feel welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognizing that it might take a few times to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or our Children's Minister about successful family worship. *If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment (we know, temper tantrums happen!), please feel free to:*
    - ☞ In Doar Hall, go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right)
    - ☞ In the Church Building, go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).
- In each of these locations you will be able to hear the service through speakers.

- **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** We recognize that some children are too old for the nursery but too young to sit through the whole service! Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. While away, they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including a Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

- **Nursery: Infant** (6 – 17 months) and **Toddler** (18 months – 3 years) are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

**Communion**—anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion this morning. **Please note:** the Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other is considered participating as fully as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today. You will receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

**Giving**—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We also have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall and Skardon Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

**Giving Envelopes**—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office or at the back of the building today.

# Covenant Cards

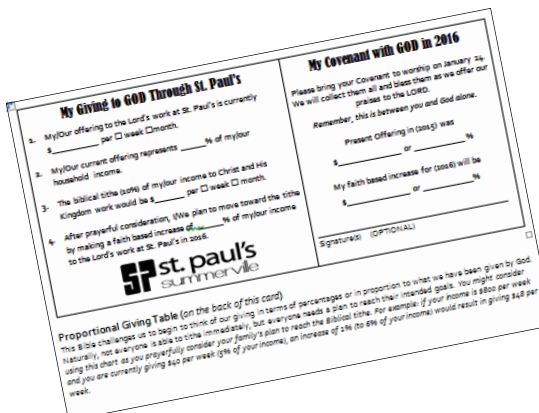
I know some people don't like pledge cards. Often that's the case because they don't like to commit to anything in life, even to God.

People in our modern culture hold a certain disdain for covenants. Marriage covenants are broken at an alarming rate. Prenuptial agreements are signed to produce an easy way out if things begin to get rocky. Many have forgone covenants altogether. And sadly, we sometimes allow this low commitment mentality to spill over into our religious life.

I say we buck the trend! I am calling St. Paul's to join with me as we "raise our Ebenezer" to God (I Samuel 7:12) and become "living stones" for Jesus (I Peter 2:5). As I said in my sermon last Sunday, we take a stand for God by living differently from the world around us. Within a low commitment culture, God is calling us to be a high commitment church. Doesn't God deserve our very best, not a cheap fling or a casual relationship?

It would be safe to say that our God is a covenanting God. From the Noahic Covenant to the Mosaic Covenant to the Davidic Covenant, our relationship with God is strengthened by covenants. Covenants lend structure to our relationships. Covenants make clear the mutually agreed upon expectations which exist within a relationship. Covenants deepen commitment levels. Writing something down is powerful.

I want to challenge you and your family to take home a covenant card today. Think and pray about returning to God a portion of what He has given you as a thank-offering to Him. Every Christian should have a financial covenant goal which begins at 10% or a tithe of our income. Some of us may not have ever made a financial agreement with God before. But remember the old saying, "If you fail to plan, you are planning to fail."



Use the worksheet and the accompanying grid to find your percentage giving toward God's Kingdom work. Create a plan, over time, to move toward a full tithe. If you are at 3% now, try 5% this year and increase by 2%

every year until you reach 10%. Some may prefer to jump right in head-first! Others who are already at the tithe, you may turn your card in as a celebration of your covenant with God!

We ask you to bring these cards back by Sunday, January 31st. Remember the covenant is between you and God. No one from the church will be calling you about your commitment. You may even fill it out with no signature attached. We will present our financial covenants to God's glory during worship and will pray that God will use our resources to bear much fruit for Christ's Kingdom in 2016.
