General Information for this morning

Welcome Families! At St. Paul's we hope to create an atmosphere in which all families feel welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognizing that it might take a few times to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or our Children's Minister about successful family worship. *If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment (we know, temper tantrums happen!), please feel free to:*
 - ☞ In Doar Hall, go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right)
 - ☞ In the Church Building, go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).

- **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** We recognize that some children are too old for the nursery but too young to sit through the whole service! Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. While away, they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including a Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

- **Nursery: Infant** (6 – 17 months) and **Toddler** (18 months – 3 years) are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

Communion—anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion this morning. **Please note:** the Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other is considered participating as fully as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today. You will receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We also have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall and Skardon Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office or at the back of the building today.

Honduras Means Love to Me

Over Spring Break, four St. Paul's youth and four adults had the privilege of going on a mission trip to the LAMB Institute Tegucigalpa, Honduras. The LAMB Institute is a missionary organization founded by Suzy McCall. Their main goal is "...to share the hope found in Christ Jesus as we care for, educate, protect, and empower those suffering extreme poverty, abuse, and exploitation in Honduras". My whole life I heard older students from our youth group tell stories of amazing experiences they had in Honduras, but I never understood why the Lamb Institute was so special to them, until I witnessed it for myself.

Thanks to the generous donations of the people at St. Paul's, we were able to take 120 pairs of new shoes to the children and staff at the Children's Home. On the first day there, we witnessed excitement and joy as the children saw our van pull up and each one raced to get in line to get their shoes! On the second day we were able to enjoy Easter at a service at the Children's Home, where the children were the ushers, the praise band, the servers and physically, the lights of Christ! It was amazing and spirit-filled! While there for the week, we spent a lot of time painting and building a prayer wall. In spite of the hard work and language barriers, work was actually gloriously fun! In the afternoons we were able to play games, color, relax, but most importantly get to know each one of God's lit-

tlest lambs in Honduras. On our one day off, we drove into Flor Del Campo and had an amazing experience as we worshipped with 200 hundred kids at the Lamb School, singing with them and hearing their voices proclaiming their love of the Lord overflowing onto the poverty filled streets they called 'home'. On the last day, we inserted our own prayers on the newly built prayer wall and were humbled by the kids as they performed a 'goodbye fiesta' for us. The tears grew heavy in my eyes as I hugged the children and staff goodbye. I am already counting down the days till I can return!

The US provides an extremely protected lifestyle for teenagers. By taking a leap of faith and going on the mission trip to Honduras, we not only learned about another part of the world, but we were also able to enrich our own relationship with Christ, while pouring His love out on the less fortunate. The experience of witnessing third world poverty first hand and telling a little child you love them, who has never been shown love by a parent, is one of the best experiences a young person can have. I encourage not only my friends in youth group, but every teenager and adult to experience Honduras and the Lamb Institute at least once in their lifetime. There is truly nothing else like it.
