The Good Neighbor Ministry@St. Paul's

For more than ten years the St. Paul's Tearoom and Gift Shop has generously supported outreach efforts from here at home to regions far away. One of the ministries that has been truly blessed by the Tearoom and Gift Shop funds is the Impact Ministries Food Distribution. Over the last three years we have served hundreds of families with thousands of pounds of food. It has grown to include Margie's closet which has been a true blessing having almost 100 visitors every month. Where did the passion come from to launch a ministry of this scope?

If you have been in ministry at all you know that God's plan is always so much greater in scope and intention than we can even imagine. As we began to minister and develop relationships with our brothers and sisters in the Summerville area we also became painfully aware of some of the crises that they faced on a daily basis; homelessness, mental illness, medical illness, unexpected death, job loss...just to name a few. Once again a group of servant leaders approached the Outreach disbursement committee and pitched yet an even more personal, intentional ministry aimed at filling the gap. In partnership with the Salvation Army that now resides on our campus we have a fund specifically aimed at helping those that we have come to know and love through the food distribution efforts. Over the last 18 months we have served close to 100 families/individuals with \$9000 to provide hope and Christ's love when they needed it the most. Whether we want to believe it or not we are all one tragedy away from slipping below the line. What a blessing it is to live and serve in a community that not only cares but authentically makes a difference in the name of Jesus Christ!

Back story: On a daily basis the St. Paul's staff would encounter folks (brothers and sisters) coming through our front doors finding themselves in difficult life circumstances that they never imagined would happen to them, unable to buy food, pay rent, electric bills or buy gas to get to work. Our resources were (and still are) very limited. One of the documentaries that inspired the staff and vestry to begin to pray about serving those in our community that struggle on a daily basis is called "The Line." You can find it on YouTube and I highly recommend anyone who has a heart for the underserved to view it. We believed that God was calling us to reach out and serve those that were falling through the cracks – the working poor who simply couldn't make ends meet. As a result with God's help and your enthusiastic support the food distribution took flight in April of 2013.

Welcome Families! At St. Paul's we hope to create an atmosphere in which all families feel welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognizing that it might take a few times to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or our Children's Minister about successful family worship. *If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment (we know, temper tantrums happen!), please feel free to:*
 - ☛ In Doar Hall, go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right)
 - ☛ In the Church Building, go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).
- In each of these locations you will be able to hear the service through speakers.

- **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** We recognize that some children are too old for the nursery but too young to sit through the whole service! Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. While away, they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including a Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

- **Nursery: Infant** (6 – 17 months) and **Toddler** (18 months – 3 years) are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

Communion—anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion this morning. **Please note:** the Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other is considered participating as fully as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today. You will receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We also have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall and Skardon Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Make way for Fresh Express! Saturday, June 11th, St. Paul's will hold our monthly Impact Ministries Food Distribution in partnership with the Low Country Food Bank. The food bank's service model is simple and cost-effective. They collect, inspect, maintain and distribute otherwise wasted food products from manufacturers, food distributors, the government, supermarkets, wholesalers and farmers and sells these food products to a grassroots network of nearly 300 member agencies providing hunger-relief services throughout the 10 coastal counties of South Carolina. As one of these agencies St. Paul's purchases the food at a much lower cost, than at retail stores and is able to feed 120 families with almost 5,000 lbs. of food each month. This month we are excited to share that we will be offering an open air fresh vegetable market called "Fresh Express." The farmer's market style produce distribution will provide five pallets of produce serving about 150 households. We will need a lot of extra hands to pull this off so please plan to volunteer on Friday June 10 and/or Saturday June 11.
