## Men's Hike Spring 2016

Well, I did it! I completed my first men's hike. I had heard about them for years and I knew that they were extremely popular in the Charleston area, so when the opportunity arose at St. Paul's Summerville, I jumped at the chance to experience the men's hike first-hand. What unfolded was a blessing beyond adequate words. Here are a few brief thoughts to encourage you to consider going on the fall hike.

First of all, you need to know that the hike is strenuous. I am in pretty decent shape, but some of the stretches we hiked had massive climbs, and in some areas there were as equally steep declines. Add 40 pounds on your back for 7+ miles a day, and that's just not something for which you might adequately prepare on the flat low-country trails of Summerville, S.C.. But it was the strain, exhaustion, and the soreness combined with the beautiful scenery that I believe were the catalysts for helping each man to go deeper with Christ and to experience deeper fellowship with one another.

During the three days, we laughed together, worshipped together, and prayed together. We even sang songs a-cappella, and every man sang, and we sounded pretty darn good! We supported and encouraged one another on the trail. Some men with heavy burdens, humbled themselves, and



turned to others for assistance. Others who were more physically ready, were glad to be able to perform the servant ministry of helping a brother in need. After all Paul says, "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2)."

Some of the greatest work God did for us was when we were hiking with random scripture verses, listening for God to speak to us a word for our

lives. Around the campfire at night, we opened up the meaning of these verses and prayed for one another's needs as the Holy Spirit directed. I hate to say it, but God can often do more in a man's life in three days in the wilderness than He can do in three years at home.

The bottom line is this: take it from a newbie, the hike is a powerful tool for going deeper with God. So wives, encourage your husbands to go in the fall. Men, bring your older children. One of the beauties of this trip was the extreme age differences, ranging from 20-71. It was a blessing to see young and old hanging out and connecting with one another. But if you come, plan to be challenged physically and spiritually, to be the best you can be for yourself, your family, and for God's greater glory.

## General Information for this morning

**Welcome Families!** At St. Paul's we hope to create an atmosphere in which all families feel welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognizing that it might take a few times to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or our Children's Minister about successful family worship. *If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment (we know, temper tantrums happen!), please feel free to:*
  - ☞ In Doar Hall, go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right)
  - ☞ In the Church Building, go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).

- **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** We recognize that some children are too old for the nursery but too young to sit through the whole service! Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. While away, they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including a Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

- **Nursery: Infant (6 – 17 months) and Toddler (18 months – 3 years)** are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

**Communion**—anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion this morning. **Please note:** the Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other is considered participating as fully as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today. You will receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

**Giving**—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We also have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall and Skardon Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

**Make way for Fresh Express!** Saturday, June 11th, St. Paul's will hold our monthly Impact Ministries Food Distribution in partnership with the Low Country Food Bank. The food bank's service model is simple and cost-effective. They collect, inspect, maintain and distribute otherwise wasted food products from manufacturers, food distributors, the government, supermarkets, wholesalers and farmers and sells these food products to a grassroots network of nearly 300 member agencies providing hunger-relief services throughout the 10 coastal counties of South Carolina. As one of these agencies St. Paul's purchases the food at a much lower cost, than at retail stores and is able to feed 120 families with almost 5,000 lbs. of food each month. This month we are excited to share that we will be offering an open air fresh vegetable market called "Fresh Express." The farmer's market style produce distribution will provide five pallets of produce serving about 150 households. We will need a lot of extra hands to pull this off so please plan to volunteer on Friday June 10 and/or Saturday June 11.
