"Table Manners"

The Book of Common Prayer professes that "The Holy Eucharist is the principal act of Christian worship on the Lord's Day (Sunday)." Jesus commanded us emphatically to "Do this is remembrance of me (Luke 22:19)." Paul captured the importance of Communion in these words, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes (1 Corinthians 11:26)." So whether we call it the Eucharist, the Mass, Holy Communion, or the Lord's Supper, the power and significance of the sacrament in Christian history should be clear to all.

But what about the mechanics of Communion? The table manners, if you will. Here are a few tips on the practice and reception of Communion.



Frequency - somewhere a tradition began that says folks cannot take Communion more than once a day. This is not true. There is nothing wrong with taking Communion as often as it is offered. The great Anglican priest John Wesley was a big proponent of taking Communion as often as possible because it is a means of strengthening grace ordained by Jesus himself.

Receiving by Faith - the Bible gives clear warning to those who are not spiritually prepared for receiving the divine mystery. Paul comments, "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord (1 Corinthians 11:27)." Adequate confession between the recipient and God and also the recipient and their

neighbors, should serve as the foundation for worthy reception. There may be days when Anglican Christians voluntarily choose not to receive due to lack of spiritual preparation. You may always come forward with arms crossed and receive a priestly blessing instead of Communion on any Sunday.

Germs - the CDC conducted a study on Communion in the 1990s which states: "the risk for infectious disease transmission by a common communion cup is very low, with appropriate safeguards -- that is, wiping the interior and exterior rim between communicants, use of care to rotate the cloth during use, and use of a clean cloth for each service." You stand more of a risk by shaking hands!

Lipstick - please blot lipstick prior to taking Communion from the chalice. The wiping with the white purificator cloth traps the lipstick deep in the cloth and is quite a challenge to clean. The Altar Guild will love you for it!

Guidance of Chalice - the recipient should grasp the chalice with the eucharistic minister and help to guide the chalice to his/her lips.

Dipping (or Intincting) - are perfectly acceptable. You may also receive in just one kind - either bread or wine - and receive the same spiritual benefits.

General Information for this morning

Welcome Families! At St. Paul's we hope to create an atmosphere in which all families feel welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognizing that it might take a few times to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or our Children's Minister about successful family worship. If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment (we know, temper tantrums happen!), please feel free to:
 - ☞ In Doar Hall, go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right)
 - ☞ In the Church Building, go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).
 In each of these locations you will be able to hear the service through speakers.

- **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** We recognize that some children are too old for the nursery but too young to sit through the whole service! Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. While away, they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including a Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

- **Nursery: Infant (6 – 17 months) and Toddler (18 months – 3 years)** are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

Communion—anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion this morning. **Please note:** the Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other is considered participating as fully as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today. You will receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We also have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall and Skardon Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office.
