As you may know by now, we are three weeks into our new Sunday school curriculum called, The Gospel Project. St. Paul's children and youth are focusing on Jesus' parables and teachings, as well as His signs and miracles. We are now set to expand our focus to adults, and therefore the entire family.

But, you may be asking, what is the Gospel Project?

- It's Gospel Centered & Theological**

The Gospel Project shows how all of Scripture testifies to who Jesus Christ is and what He has done (Luke 24:44). It will help ground us in the faith once for all delivered to the saints (Jude 3). The Christ connection in each session clarifies how the individual stories of Scripture point forward and backward to the center point that gives all meaning—the person and work of Jesus Christ.

- It's Missional**

The Gospel Project will help us follow in the steps of our missionary God (John 20:21). Each lesson shows how the story of God's redemptive work directly affects our missional mind-set. It will also help us consider what Spirit-empowered living looks like in our specific context.

- It's Family Friendly**

What really sets The Gospel Project apart is how family friendly it is. Think about it, when jumping in the SUV getting ready to head home after church, or sitting down to eat lunch you may ask your children, "So what did you learn in Sunday School this morning?" And to their surprise you already know because you went over the same lesson. The Gospel Project provides a Family App, activity pages that makes family worship time accessible, relatable, and even fun.

Our prayer is that you and your entire family will know the overarching Bible story—the grand narrative that tells us about our creation, our fall into sin, God's work of redemption, and the future restoration that is coming. **Welcome to The Gospel Project.**

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship.

• **Kids Church** (K3 –2nd grade) starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

• Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:

- ✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.
- ✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.
