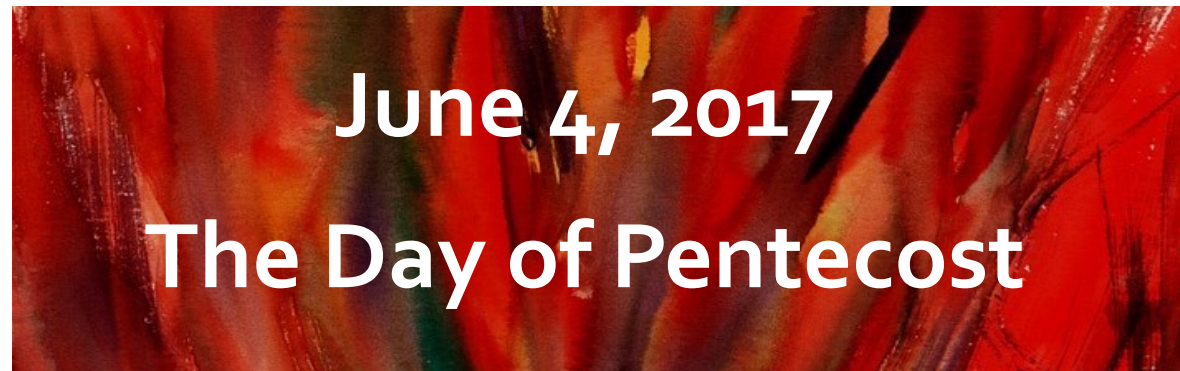

We are making history together. The Christian church, through the years, has been known much more for schism than she has for unity. This is particularly sad when we remember the priestly prayer of our Lord as he prayed "that they (His church) may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me (John 17:21)." What a blessing that our four churches are able to witness Christ's body coming back together again! It is a historic event and an answer to prayer.

We would like to thank everyone for helping to make this service possible today. We pray that God might bring us other opportunities for worship, fellowship, and service together. In this spirit, our undesignated offerings in the alms basins will be given to Cummings Theological Seminary, right here in Summerville, as a sign of our joint mission and ministry with the Reformed Episcopal Church.

## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship. *If you need to take your children out of the service for a moment please use these locations:*

☞ Doar Hall: Go to the Atrium (to your left) or St. Paul's central (to your right).

☞ The Church Building: Go to the Family room behind the choir area (front left).

In each of these locations you will be able to hear the service through speakers.

• **Kid's Church (3 years old through Kindergarten):** Children who wish to go to Kid's Church will leave the service after the Gospel is read and return for Holy Communion. In Kids Church they will participate in a liturgy that mirrors that of the church service, including Bible teaching at their level, song, prayers, and confession.

• **Nursery: Infant** (6 – 17 months) and **Toddler** (18 months – 3 years) are located on the first floor of the Children/Youth Building. Our experienced staff is CPR and First Aid certified, and pagers are provided to notify parents if necessary.

**Communion**—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

**Giving**—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

**Giving Envelopes**—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.
