**Fr. John: Parish Chaplain To St. Paul's Pastoral Care Ministry**

I have the pleasure of being able to enjoy the most blessed parochial ministry that every priest prays he will live long enough to experience. As a priest retired from full time ministry, I no longer have to be involved in the tedious and very demanding administrative responsibilities of running a parish, with its endless series of meetings and constant budgetary pressures.

After 55 years of administering parishes, I am now exclusively working the front-line ministries of serving my Lord dealing directly with the spiritual needs of His people. When we entered mandatory retirement after 17 years as the rector of Epiphany Church, in Eutawville, SC, for me, and 11 years as a successful restaurateur for Toni, we thought we were being put out to pasture. We reluctantly planned to while-away our remaining years among friends in Pawleys Island but the Lord mercifully summoned us in the person of Fr. Michael Lumpkin. He invited us to come to Summerville and what blessings the Lord had in store for us here at St. Paul's.

To me, Mike offered the opportunity to come alongside Cathy McGrew, who directed a wonderful pastoral care ministry. I would serve as chaplain to assist the members, take my rotation in preaching and celebrating the Sunday worship. I would also preside at the mid-week healing prayer service in the church, serve as liaison minister between the parish and the community, and minister one-on-one to our parish members as needed. To Toni, he offered office space for her catering business and the use of the parish commercial kitchen, as needed.

All of this took place in September of 2010. We have been here at St. Paul's now for 7 years and we have never been happier in our entire lives. First Mike and now Tripp have been faithful to the arrangements we were offered. Knowing and working with the staff and wonderful families here at St. Paul's has been a true blessing beyond all expectations.

As liaison to the community, I have served as a board member of the Summerville-Dorchester Museum, from which I recently stepped down after three years of service, and continue as a volunteer. I am active with the Summerville Area Ministerial Association and currently serve as its president. I also serve as a volunteer counselor at the Hebron-Grace Home in Santee, SC. I have continued serving since its founding in 2002 while I was still pastoring Epiphany Church in Eutawville. In that capacity I drive to Santee at 7:30 every Wednesday morning, spend about two hours there, and return to St. Paul's around 11:30.

If I appear to have a pleasant disposition when you encounter me around the parish, it is because I know I am the most blessed among men and have the pleasure of ministering to some of the best people I have ever known in one of the greatest parishes in Christendom.

## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

**Welcome** to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship.

- **New Format:** Our format is changing to accommodate the new summer service times and the needs of our families. Kids Church (K3 -2nd grade) starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

- Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:
  - ✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.
  - ✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

**Communion**—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

**Giving**—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

**Giving Envelopes**—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.
