Site Plan Task Force Report From July 12, 2017

About 60 days ago, the Site Plan Task Force began meeting, praying and discerning how St. Paul's can be the best stewards of the facilities entrusted to us. It is both timely and relevant to examine the future of St. Paul's facilities, now.

Over the past few years, maintenance on Skardon Hall has been deferred. The roof has leaked (but does not now), the siding is deteriorating, rest rooms need updating, and much of the HVAC needs replacing.

On the other hand, the Master Plan for our campus, developed and adopted by the parish in the late 1990s, establishes the next campus project as the revitalization of Ambler Hall. The plan calls for Ambler Hall to be renovated for administration offices and adult ministries. If we choose this path, it will be at least a 2-year process—planning, fundraising and renovating.

St. Paul's is currently faced with the decision. Which of these buildings should take priority? In order to make the best possible decision, we need to look at what Ambler Hall can be. The task force has asked for and the Vestry has approved spending up to \$7,500 for preliminary plans for revitalizing Ambler Hall.

When these plans are completed, we will prayerfully review the options. We will explore allocation of space for all current ministries and identified future ministries. We will look at creating a welcoming environment for newcomers and visitors. We will take into account the resources available and how to best utilize them all.

God has a plan for our ministries. The vestry has asked this task force to meet, pray and listen for His word. That is where we currently are.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship.

• **New Format:** Our format is changing to accommodate the new summer service times and the needs of our families. Kids Church (K3 -2nd grade) starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

• **Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:**
✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.
✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.
