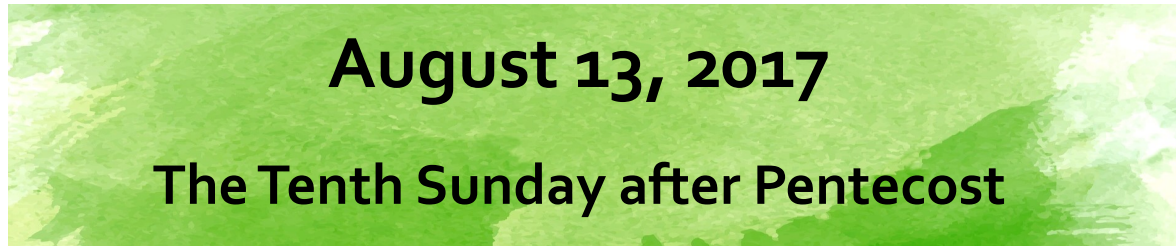

A Week in the Life of the Faith@Home Children's Coordinator

What does your week look like?

During the non-crazy part of the year, prepping for Kid's Church is the number one project I work on. I put lessons together and find good curriculum for the upcoming semester of classes. During the school year (the crazy time) I spend my week prepping for Kid's Church. I get the lessons together for each class and each leader. I gather anything the lessons calls for such as craft materials, objects, etc. With that I also call and contact volunteers to email them the lesson plans for the upcoming Sunday. The same prep goes for Sunday School along with making sure all the classrooms are prepared and touching base with the teachers every so often.

For those who may not know, what does Kid's Church look like?

On Sunday mornings I have the pleasure of leading Kid's Church. We just increased the age from 5k to second grade. As the children come in we have a short free play time to get acclimated. We have music playing and the kids have dance offs. There is a reading center, Lego center, puppet center, and a coloring sheet center. Once everyone has been checked in and settled we gather on the rug for the kids to calm down and prepare their hearts for worship. Each week one child plays the role of crucifer and leads all the children to the pews.

We have a children's version of the lectionary or Book of Common Prayer and we use this. Every Sunday the kids go through the prayers of the people, confession, gospel reading, bible lesson, and songs. Kid's Church mirrors the liturgical services so when they transition over to "big church" they already know the liturgy. After we go through our service we lead the kids over to Doar Hall or the Church Building for them to participate in communion with their families.

What keeps you excited?

Sharing Jesus with the little ones is the most exciting part. There are some mornings when it is that encouraging factor that helps me get out of bed. There are some weeks when they kids don't get why we are doing what we are doing but then there are the weeks when they do and I just think to myself this is why I do what I do!

What do you think gets looked over in Children's ministry?

Children, for the most part, are not seen as the next generation or the future. Most people think we give them a snack and a coloring sheet but we do so much more than that with the kids. There is a lot of value in passing what we do on to them and starting so young is why we do it.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship.

- **New Format:** Our format is changing to accommodate the new summer service times and the needs of our families. Kids Church (K3 –2nd grade) starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

- Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:

- ✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.

- ✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.
