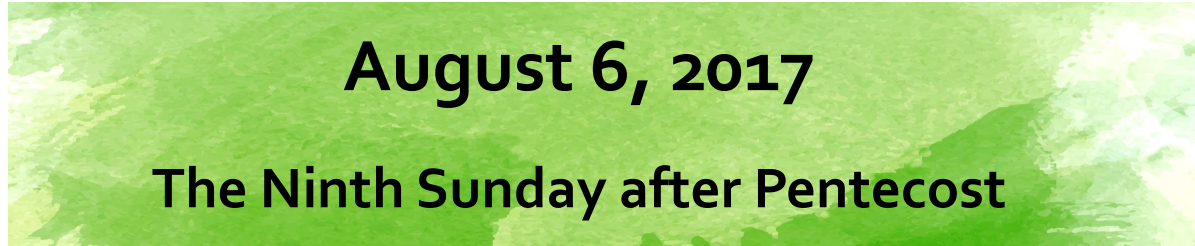

A Week in the Life of the Youth Minister

What does the beginning of your week look like?

The way I think about each week of ministry is really splitting it into two mini weeks. In other words, Monday and Tuesday are spent prepping for Wednesday night youth group. Whereas Wednesday and Thursday and sometimes Friday is spent prepping for Sunday things. Of course if I am preaching then the entire week is dedicated to sermon prep as well.

When do you work with the youth?

The days I am primarily with youth are Sunday's and Wednesday's. On Sunday night I am with the middle schoolers where there is a ton of excitement. Our middle school youth group has just exploded, so there is a lot of energy and the site of a great future for our youth at St. Paul's. On Wednesday night I am with the high schoolers that tend to be rock solid and steady, and what I mean by that is St. Paul's has a great group of high schoolers that are committed. They are sold out to Jesus that translates into attendance, commitment to each other, and respect for all the adults leading them. We just lost a great Senior class, so I am anxious to see what God does with them, but also anxious to see what next year will be like without them. We need some new leaders to step up.

Of course my only time with the youth is not just at youth group it may be sporting events, confirmation classes, Sunday school, diocese retreats, youth outings, and of course our parish services.

What is something interesting about your job?

That's easy, it's working with the next generation. It never ceases to amaze me (and my youth leaders would chime in as well) how incredible these young adults are . . . we all consider ourselves fortunate to be able to enter their lives and speak into their lives and come alongside them. I have always said that those working with youth have to be real, because they can always spot a fake from a mile away. I may not be the atypical goof ball youth leader, but I always try to convey to my youth that I care about them.

I would also add that the ministry brings a lot of ups and downs. Through the school year we are full throttle, but during the summer we can pull back a bit and get ready to launch again.

What does the end of your week look like?

As I said above Wednesday and Thursday is spent prepping for Sunday things, which include confirmation classes, Sunday school, and middle school youth group and of course my sermon if I am not quite done with it yet.

So in a nutshell how would you describe your time here?

Crazy busy, but in a good way. I love pastoral ministry and yet I have a passion for the next generation of young people growing up in our culture today. And, in a round about way I get to do both whether it's youth group, or confirmation, or being a lay Eucharistic minister, or preaching I am able to juggle all of it! God is good!

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in first grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not used to this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest or Tina Smith about successful family worship.

• **New Format:** Our format is changing to accommodate the new summer service times and the needs of our families. Kids Church (K3 - 2nd grade) starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

• Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:

- ✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.
- ✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

Giving Envelopes—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.

Prayer teams. Please begin praying and fasting (if possible) toward next Wednesday, August 9. Convening at St. Paul's will be the Standing Committee and all the diocesan clergy. Pray for God's direction, peace, and courage for Bishop Lawrence, the Standing Committee, our legal team, and our clergy. Thanks so much!
