Yes! In Psalm 78:4, we are told through Moses as he speaks passionately to God's people, the Israelites, "We will not hide them from our children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that He has done."

The "grand" generation is called by God to be His ambassador to the coming generations. The importance of this "grand" role cannot be emphasized enough. Yet, not many grandparents, grand aunts/uncles, seniors know this truth. Instead, many believe their role as defined by our western culture: to retire, step aside and let the next generation step up.

The average age for a first-time grandparent is 47. The average life span in our country is until the age of 77. That means that the average grandparent is in their God-given role for thirty years. Therefore, the average American grandparent spends 40% of their life as a person destined by God to have a powerful spiritual influence over their children and grandchildren. Deuteronomy 4:9 says, "... make known the things your eyes have seen ... to your children and your children's children."

I have found one of the best ways to encourage and equip grandparents is for them to attend GrandCamp. GrandCamp is a fun filled, five-day overnight camping program designed for grandparents and their grandchildren to have fun, meet new friends and develop a closer bond together with God. It is a golden time to build memories between generations that last a lifetime.
